

Judging the Judges: Ratings for Those Running for Judicial Seats or to Retain Seats

The following organizations rate those who are running for judicial seats or are seeking to retain currently held judicial seats. Each organization (or in some cases collaborations of organizations) provides explanations for their rating system and their recommendations. Courts Matter Illinois suggests you look at more than one organization and compare ratings.

They, too, put out a rating system for those running for judicial seats and seeking retention seats. They ask for community input from those who have experience with the judicial system as they develop their rankings. We have found their ranking system to be one of the easiest to navigate and extremely comprehensive in terms of the information that it provides.
